WORD FROM THE PASTOR

He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God? Micah 6:8

Last month I preached three sermons about mercy and justice. My goal for each of these sermons was to do two things. The first was to raise the awareness of God's call to help those. We help in ways we call "mercy ministries" where we help the immediate needs of the person. Through food banks, clothes collections, funds for areas affected by disaster, service projects and many other ways we are engaged in mercy ministries. Another type of mercy ministries is when we connect with the people around us. These ministries are essential as they are about letting people know that they are not alone, there is a people that care. Whether the ministry helps with a resource, physical or emotional need, God has called us to respond.

The other way we help people is through Justice ministries. There comes a time when we see that things are not right and we are tired of just helping the people that experience the symptoms of the injustice. We are called to act and pray for the current situations to change and to walk besides those struggling.

The second goal that I had was to bridge the artificial division of evangelism with mercy and justice. Jesus didn't call us to be about personal salvation only nor about mercy and justice only. We were called to transform ourselves and the world. Our salvation should propel us to care for others especially those in need. Likewise, our service should reflect the grace and love of Jesus that we know in our heart. Knowing the good news of Jesus transform us so we can walk with others so they can know Jesus' hope as well.

I invite you to reflect on both your salvation and how it inspires you to share hope with others.

Here are some suggestions of ways one can participate:

- 6. Provide a meal via a gift card to the pastor's favorite restaurant or a home-cooked or takeout meal. Make a gift card large enough to include the spouse or other friend and consider offering free babysitting if needed. Deliver meals at a time convenient to the recipient.
- 7. Consider giving gift cards that encourage self-care (massage, movie theater, a favorite local restaurant or upscale espresso spot).
- 8. Provide tickets to a sporting or cultural event or concert they will enjoy.
- 9. Give a service that your pastors are unlikely to get for themselves but would appreciate (house cleaning, landscaping, tailoring, consulting or financial advising).
- 10. Give a group gift, from a group or to a group.
- 11. Create a photo calendar with inspiring Bible passages or photos of church events creating happy memories for the pastor.

Not how to enter the promise- Five Unfruitful Practices



The Israelites spent 400 years in slavery in Egypt. God sent Moses to rescue and lead His people out of slavery and into the land God has for them. Except..... They didn't want to go. And they complained. And they didn't want to do things differently. And they didn't want to help others. The book of Exodus has God parting the Red Sea for the Israelites to escape through and their response is to complain that things are hard now.

We shouldn't be too hard on the Israelites because in some ways we are just like them. In October we are going to be using the example of the Israelite faith community as it emerged from Egypt to help us examine how not to respond to issues of today that threaten us being a fruitful church.

The mission of CCIP-Zimbabwe is to show the love of God in practical ways. The team will also visit partnership churches represented on this group. Team members will have a rare opportunity to live with wonderful host families in Mutare during working days. They will be working together, worshiping together, and sharing diverse life-experiences with each other in a family-like environment.

The cost for this trip is \$4,500.00 per person covering air travel, ground travel while in Zimbabwe, food, two nights motel, accident insurance, administration and some project money.
