WORD FROM THE PASTOR

⁴¹ "Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, ⁴² but few things are needed—or indeed only one.⁴³ Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her." *Luke 10:41-42*

Our culture wants us to be Martha. Be productive, be busy. Hard work will lead to success. We see this in the church as well. This month I will be preaching on James and asking us to be "doers of the word". Action and hard work is important. If people don't respond to needs, act to achieve goals, work to better themselves and the world around them none of that happens. Jesus clearly call us to feed and help those in need and also teaching and helping people become disciples. There is much in our faith that inspires us to be Marthas- doers of the word.

I also want to encourage us to hear what Jesus is saying to Martha. She is stressed out trying make it all perfect by herself. While she has good intension, she has allowed the stress to drain her of compassion. The work has become her focus. Jesus invites Martha to see that her focus should be on God. How have you been able to focus on God? It may see like a strange or difficult question to answer so perhaps we should first think how do I focus on people around us. To be present and pay attention to others we need to but away distractions, listen to them, and give them time. If we rush through a conversation, or work without stopping, or are distracted by thoughts or tech more often than not the person we were with will feel like we are not present. Martha is not present with Jesus. The work does need to get done but she has let the work take away from the people around her and God.

I invite you this month as we continue living our faith and being "doers of the word" to remember to take some time with Jesus. Undistracted, not rushed, not on a time limit moment to experience the restoring peace and hope we find in Jesus.

Unified Board

The administrative board has gone on a journey since February of discerning how Andover UMC can live into our mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ through connection with God, with each other and with our community. This discernment led the board to an idea called Simplified Accountable Structure (SAS). The point of SAS is to mobilize the church out of committee meetings back to its purpose of ministry and mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ.

How this model works is that the four Book of Discipline required boards (Administrative board, Trustees, Finance, SPRC) are condensed to 1 leadership board of 9 members. We are referring to the leadership board as the Unified Board. That is the simplified part.

The accountable part is a cultural and adaptive shift from management to governance from the Unified Board. The members of the board do not represent a ministry, mission, or group. They will represent the entire church. The meetings for the unified board will not be about reporting what has happened, rather they will focus on how we are moving towards our mission of making disciples of Jesus through connection. A metaphor one can use is a bike. It doesn't matter how hard you peddle if you are not steering you straight on the path. The unified board will be like the handle bars on a bike helping keep our faith community focused. The unified board will set big picture goals that the church can work together to accomplish. Another image is that if you don't know what your target is then you have no way of knowing if you hit it. Knowing your target allows you to aim, apply the energy needed, and knowledge if you hit the target. Having clearly defined goals that we can assess progress toward is the accountable part.

The structure part is about maximizing volunteer time in the work, ministry, and mission. The unified board discerns goals for the church and sets into place guiding principles that equip the pastor, staff, and ministry teams to do ministry. The unified board works with the pastor on assessing how the church is moving toward our goals and the pastor works with staff and ministry team leaders to define objectives, recruit volunteers and do the ministry. Plans for ministries will not need to go back to a committee meeting to be voted on or discussed. Accountable permission is given to the church to act. This doesn't mean that we can do any ministry. No matter how big a church is there is a limit in the ministries and outreach a church can offer. We can't be all things to all people. We can only be Andover UMC and having the goals before us helps focus us on being the faith community God has called us to be. The role of the pastor is to continue to proclaim who AUMC is and what are goals for the year are for everyone to know. Ministry teams will work with the pastor, staff, and team leaders to align goals and activities so their team and activities will help move us toward our goal. If someone has a new idea, they will be able to discuss it with the pastor or staff and if it fits within the mission and goals then the church can act on the idea. It will not have to go through committees for approval. The pastor, staff, and ministry teams can act and do the ministry inspired by the Holy Spirit.

This summer the administrative council has led in home meetings to discuss the idea. At those meetings we fielded questions and we are continuing to take questions. There will be an Ice Cream Social on Sept. 12th at 3pm to answer the questions given as well as questions people bring to the meeting. We invite you to come and ask the questions you want answered.

On Sept. 26th we will have a church vote if we want to go to the unified board model. There will be a potluck at noon with a place to drop off a ballot vote. Before the potluck is over we will count and report on the result of the vote.

I (Pastor Ryan) encourage you to ask questions and to attend both the Ice Cream Social and the potluck. The Holy Spirit is moving in Andover and whether it is through the unified board or some other means we are being called to re-engage our mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ through connecting with God, with each other, and with our community.

Quilters Mission

Many of you may have seen the "Happy Quilters" plaque on one of the rooms in the hallway close to the office. This is the current room, the location of which has changed many times over the decades, where a group of women and a man have met, quilting away, talking, joking, laughing, sharing our life stories, and taking care of each other. When asked to present today, I asked those in attendance last Wednesday for things they might want you to know. I was told many stories and given a 2008 program that included a presentation that the quilters were around 40 years strong, beginning in the 1960's. That makes us some 53 years strong today.

We do hand quilting, which is becoming a lost art. People get on our list and wait longer than we would like to get their quilt into the frame! We hand quilt for 50 cents a yard today. When I joined, it was .25 cents a yard. When they began the quilting mission, they charged 3 cents a yard! I clearly remember my first day, after spending three hours quilting, I laughed and told the ladies that I had just made 25 cents for mission work!

How our mission works is we take in quilt tops, batting, and the backing from the maker/owner of the quilt. We charge for our quilting by the yard of thread. All of the donations received for many years went to Youthville. The 2008 report stated at that time we had given over \$10,000 to Youthville. Today, we include several different local missions who are pleased to receive the proceeds of our loving labor.

The last couple of years, as you might imagine due to the pandemic, we did not get to quilt as much as usual. We are 6 strong today, including one who comes when she can to knit and chat! We would love to see you at our door and share our skills and our mission with you. If you have any interest in learning to hand quilt, or if you just want to find fellowship with other women, join us on Wednesday mornings from 8:30ish to 12ish. Or, if you have a quilt that you would want to put on our list or know of someone who does, just drop by and we would be glad to talk! We love the work that we do and we have a blast every week!
