ORD FROM THE PASTOR

Know well the condition of your flocks, and give attention to your herds,

²⁴ for riches do not last forever, nor a crown for all generations.

When the grass is gone, and new growth appears, and the herbage of the mountains is gathered, the lambs will provide your clothing,

and the goats the price of a field.

One of the things I love about the bible is no matter how many times I have read it I always find new things. This scripture from Proverbs 27 I found while searching the word "new" in the bible using biblegateway.com. I was thinking of the new year and wanted a scripture to help us create momentum. New Years resolution can be a useful way to make changes in our life. With the calendar starting over, it can help us feel like we can do the same. We can begin to make goals and consider deadlines when we hope to accomplish them. Some early dates you might consider in your goal setting are:

> Easter is March 31st 2024 50th Day of the year is February 19th 100th Day of the year is April 10th

The Scripture from proverb is not about New Years Resolutions but it is about setting goals or plans for oneself. We might not feel called to start raising sheep yet we do have a call for 2024. The author encourages first to take a good look at your flock- assess your situation. Before you can improve your career, health, relationships, hobbies, and faith you have to know where you are at. This can be difficult, but an honest evaluation is required before we can reach our goals. It is after assessing that we then begin to give attention to the "herd"- that area in our life we want to change. The author shares that the work on the herd is more valuable than riches as all things pass away. Applying the proverb to ourselves, the work and attention we are able to put towards our goals will be more a lifelong boost. It can provide comfort, enjoyment, purpose, and in some cases employment for years to come. I encourage you to set goals for 2024 with hope and joy of what God will do in the next year.

>>> VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNTIES

Want a place to volunteer and work with a friend from AUMC who can show you the ropes? Here are a couple of good places to consider:

Bike Walk Wichita (BWW):

Located at 325 N. St Francis, across from the WAVE.

This is a 501c non-profit organization that provides bicycle services to anyone in need. They are open 4 days a week Tu & Th [2-8] Fr & Sat [1-4]

We take donated bicycles of all sizes and shapes. Those that are not repairable are stripped of useable parts. Those that are fixable go into different categories.

<u>Voucher bikes</u>: These are bikes volunteers have fixed and made road worthy. They are given away to those with a voucher from other non-profits such as International Refuge Committee and several others. The receipt of a bike makes finding and getting to a job much more likely.

<u>Earn a bike</u>: This program lets those with no money to trade volunteer hours for a bike. They complete 15 hours of volunteer service and are then allowed to choose a repairable bike and fix it up for themselves.

<u>Kids bikes</u>: All smaller childrens bikes are repaired and given away. A parent or guardian must come with a child. Kids choose a bike and ride away smiling. No charge, these are free.

<u>Sale Bikes</u>: Some of the donated bikes are in very nice condition and are refurbished and then sold at very reasonable prices. BWW also has "open shop". When space is available anyone can bring their own bike down and work on it. Experienced volunteers will help them, but won't do the work. Parts are available to purchase at very reasonable prices.

BWW is also involved with organizing many local bicycle and walking events throughout Wichita. Anyone is welcome to join in.

Habitat for Humanity:

This non-profit builds houses. They are built for families in need of permanent housing. Families must be able to pay for the house but they buy the house on a zero percent loan. Families, called Partner Families, must complete classes on finance, maintenance, etc. And they are required to put in about 400 hours of volunteering on other homes prior to being selected for a future build. Volunteers can be single individuals but usually come from businesses or organizations. The exception is a group called "core volunteers". I'm part of that group. Core volunteers work Tues-Sat during the builds and do most of the main construction including building and marking walls per blueprint, erecting walls, setting the trusses, enclosing walls, roof decking, and installing doors and windows. On days with community volunteers, the cores lead small teams to complete all the listed tasks.

Habitat of Wichita has built over 300 homes. The "rock the block" area in NE Wichita of approximately 2 square miles just completed the 100th home in that area.


