Happy New Year Andover!

As we end 2025 and move to 2026 I invite you to consider a passage from the gospel of John:

Jesus replied, “Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again.”

This was a very troubling thing for Nicodemus to hear. He questioned what did it even mean to be “born again”. Jesus was speaking of starting life on a new path. By embracing the path of Jesus, we are embracing a new way of living. In essence we are made new. Jesus invites everyone to experience this grace of letting go of the old so they can walk in the light, joy and love of God.

What would it look like for you to be made new in 2026? The start of the new year is a great time for making a change. I encourage you to take a moment and reflect who you want to be at the end of 2026. What is God calling you to change? How is God challenging you to grow?



A stable presence of his youth Dr Putnam saw that instead of a bowling league which included a great amount of fellowship, people were bowling alone. This insight led to a study that discovered the decline in all social fellowship activities from bowling, service clubs, political parties, and even church.

INFORMATION

Winter Weather Cancellations/Delays Instructions

Sunday: We will have Sunday Services at regular time, 10am, if the roads are passable. We will only cancel the service in the worst of situations. If this occurs, we will send out a One Call Now message, notify channel 12, KWCH-TV, and post on FACEBOOK. ***First of all, please consider your safety and only attend if you are comfortable being out in the weather.

Wednesday: On Wed., our plan is to have the lot cleared for evening activities unless we are in an active snow storm. Our cancellation policy for Wed. is if the Andover schools are cancelled, we will cancel as well. We will send out a One Call Now message, notify channel 12, KWCH-TV, and FACEBOOK.

Parking Lot Conditions: When snow falls prior to Sunday, we will clear the front half of the parking lot, if sufficient depth warrants. If it is still snowing on Sunday mornings, we may wait until the snowfall stops before clearing the front half of the lot. Feel free to use the covered drive to drop off passengers at the front door.

Delays or Cancellations: In the event Pastor Ryan Lynch and the General Board determine that a delay or change in schedule is necessary for church activities, information will be distributed via our One Call Now, notify channel 12, KWCH-TV, and FACEBOOK.
